



# Hazard Hunt!

## Worksheet

### Instructions:

Identify a minimum of 25 hazards at your residence or work place. For each indicate the following:

- The hazard
- Recommendation(s) for correction (if known)
- Who should be responsible for making correction.
- Indicate the priority level for the correction (see description below)
- Category -- Categories of hazards to look for would include (but are not limited to): electrical; structural; fire; surfaces that would contribute to slips and falls; traffic - pedestrians, automobiles, bicycles; health hazards such as atmospheric, and noise. If you see someone acting in an unsafe manner, note that and identify it as a hazard.
- Priority level for making corrections:
  - Level 1: Correction to be made immediately.
  - Level 2: Need to get materials to implement correction - can be done within the month.
  - Level 3: Corrective measures will be costly and require more time to implement. Corrections in the long-range plan of action.
